




Whole School Home Learning

Challenge - Sketch:

Make a viewfinder and look closely - Find something in nature you like the look of. Perhaps it is a flower, the bark of a tree, an unusual shaped leaf, spongy moss, a feather, a cone.... Have a good look at it. Now have a **really** good look at it. You could use a magnifying glass or hand lens if you have one

Make a viewfinder to focus on a part of your 'subject' to sketch up close! You may like the texture or pattern and use this as a focus of your drawing



Or you could use your viewfinder to 'zoom out'!

Spot:



What can you see? Go on a wildlife walk or look through your window. How good are your spotting skills? What can you see? If you get a chance to look at different times of day can you spot different animals and birds? Use the ID guide on the link below to help you or maybe you have your own book or guide

Make a pair of binoculars! Recycle toilet paper tubes and make a pair of safari binoculars! Decorate them in paper or draw your own design and see what you can spot! (hopefully not a lion!)

Challenge - make a wildlife note book to jot down your findings or research more into what wild creatures you spotted, at what time and where!



Rub:

Bark rubbing - if you like to feel the texture of natural things why not give bark rubbing a go? Grab a piece of paper, some crayons (wax crayons are better used on their side) find a knobbly tree and create some bark art!



Scatter:

Go ahead and scatter some seeds! Follow the instructions on the link (Wildlife Trusts website) below and practise your throwing skills whilst planting beautiful wild flowers for all our pollinators. Don't worry if you don't have powder clay - you could add a bit of clay if you have any or wet, heavy soil instead
