

## Subject Specific Vocabulary

Palm Sunday	This is the Sunday before Easter. When Jesus' entry into Jerusalem is celebrated.
Holy Week	The week when Christians remember the last week of Jesus' life
The Last Supper	The last meal that Jesus ate with his disciples before he was crucified.
Eucharist	The symbolic meal that Christians still share today to remember the Last Supper.
Good Friday	The day when Christians remember Jesus' death on the cross.
Easter Sunday	The day when Christians celebrate Jesus rising from the dead.
Resurrection	Resurrection means the raising to life from the dead.

Pupils will know that Christians see Holy Week as the culmination of Jesus' earthly life, leading to his death and resurrection.

Pupils will be able to say what each event of Holy week means for Christians today inc: Palm Sunday: washing disciples' feet at the Last Supper: Bread and wine at the Last Supper; Judas' betrayal; Peter's denial; the Crucifixion; the Resurrection.

Pupils know that most Christians believe that Jesus rose from the dead and so is alive today. They can explain why Christians call this Good Friday

Pupils are able to discuss the idea of Jesus rising from the dead and can make connections to the 'Big Story' of Christianity.

They can express their own view if this was a Good Friday?

### By the end of this unit...

I can retell the main events of Holy Week and how they impact how Christians live and worship (e.g. Eucharist)

I understand the importance of the events of Holy Week in explaining why Jesus came to earth
