<p>NC Objectives</p> <p>To use painting to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination.</p> <p>To develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.</p> <p>To know about the work of a range of artists describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines and making links to their own work.</p>	<p>Red, yellow and blue are primary colours.</p> <p>Primary colours can't be made by mixing any other colour.</p> <p>Piet Mondrian was an artist who used primary colours in his abstract art.</p> <p>Mondrian used primary colours with black lines and white spaces.</p> <p>Abstract art doesn't show pictures of things but uses colour, lines and shapes to express feelings.</p> <p>You can mix primary colours together to make new colours, which are called secondary colours.</p> <p>Secondary colours are orange, green and purple.</p> <p>Red + yellow = orange, yellow + blue = green, blue + red = purple.</p> <p>You can mix secondary colours together to make more colours.</p> <p>Mark Rothko carefully mixed colours in simple blocks and lines in his abstract art.</p> <p>Neutral colours are calm and gentle colours that don't stand out, such as brown, black, grey and white.</p> <p>Adding white to a colour makes it lighter, called tints.</p> <p>Tinting changes a colour from bright to pale, such as pink.</p> <p>Paul Klee experimented with different types of colours and simple shapes.</p> <p>Adding black to a colour makes it darker, called shades.</p> <p>Shading changes a colour from bright to dark and can change the feeling of a painting.</p> <p>Jackson Pollock was an abstract artist who invented 'drip painting'.</p> <p>Pollock used different tools to drip, pour and splatter paint onto a canvas from above.</p> <p>Warm colours, such as red, orange and yellow, are often used to paint happy pictures.</p> <p>Cool colours, such as green, blue and purple, are often used to paint sad pictures.</p> <p>Robert and Sonia Delaunay invented a new style of art called orphism.</p> <p>The Delaunay's used very bright colours and lots of simple shapes like circles, triangles and squares.</p> <p>Wassily Kandinsky is thought by many to be the first abstract artist.</p> <p>Kandinsky was the first painter to just use colours and shapes.</p>	<p>primary colours</p> <p>abstract art</p> <p>collage</p> <p>Piet Mondrian</p> <p>secondary colours</p> <p>Mark Rothko</p> <p>neutral colours</p> <p>tints</p> <p>Paul Klee</p> <p>Shades</p> <p>Jackson Pollock</p> <p>warm</p> <p>cool</p> <p>orphism</p> <p>Robert and Sonia Delaunay</p> <p>Wassily Kandinsky</p>
