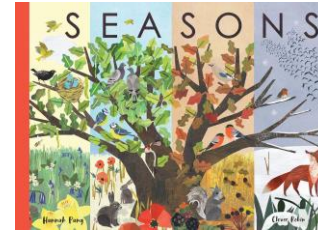


Subject Specific Vocabulary

season	one of the 4 parts of the year; spring, summer, autumn and winter
spring	a season between March and May
summer	a season between June and August
autumn	a season between September and November
winter	a season between December and February
hibernate	to sleep through the winter
temperature	how warm or cool something is
weather	the conditions and temperature outside

Seasonal changes



Links to the National Curriculum:

- observe changes across the 4 seasons
- observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies

What do I already know?

- the four seasons are spring, summer, autumn and winter
- there are different types of weather including rain, wind, snow sun
- spring is where flowers start to grow, animals come out of hibernation
- summer can be hot and sunny, has blue skies, flowers are open, places can be very dry and there is more daylight
- autumn starts to get colder, leaves change colour and fall from the trees, and the nights get darker faster
- winter gets colder and it sometimes snows
- different clothes are worn in different seasons

- understand the changes that take place in autumn, winter, spring and summer
- investigate how you can measure rainfall
