

Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Judaism	the religion of the Jewish people
Synagogue	the building where Jewish people meet to worship and study
Torah	the 'law' found in the first five books of the Hebrew Scriptures
Rabbi	a Jewish teacher who also leads the people in prayer
Sabbath	the day of the week kept holy for rest and prayer
Yahweh	a Jewish word for God that means 'the one who is all'
