community	a group of people living in the same place
responsibility	something you're required to do as a member of a community
identity	somebody's sense of self - things like somebody's gender, ethnicity, faith, culture, hobbies, family
democracy	the will of the people - people vote and the majority decide
human rights	the basic rights and freedoms that belong to every person in the world, from birth until death
liberty	being free in society to make choices
tolerance	acceptance of others whose actions, beliefs, appearance, religion, culture, ethnicity, nationality may be different from your own
British Values	What it means to be British - Democracy, Rule of Law, Respect and Tolerance, Individual Liberty
