<b>Genesis</b>	the first book of the Bible that tells the creation story
<b>Harvest</b>	a special time when Christians say thank you for creation
<b>Grace</b>	a special prayer that says thank you for the food we have
<b>God</b>	Christians believe that God is Trinity and that God loves His creation
