

Vocabulary	
creator	Central to understanding Christian belief about God.
Creation	The world and everything God has created.
Genesis	The first book of the Bible, containing the Creation and Fall stories.
Bible	The sacred text containing the stories and teachings Christians follow.
The Fall	The name Christians give to the events in Genesis 3 when humans disobeyed God and their relationship with Him was damaged.
sin	Wrong thoughts, words or actions that go against God's ways.
obedience	Following God's guidance and doing what He asks.
Ten Commandments	God's guidelines that help Christians understand how to live.
forgiveness	Being released from blame or resentment after someone has done wrong and is sorry.
temptation	The desire or opportunity to do something that you know may be wrong.
Steward/Stewardship	Looking after God's creation on His behalf.

What do I already know?
In KS1 I learned:
- Christians believe that God created the world. - Christians believe that God's creation is good. - Christians believe that people are part of God's creation and are made in God's image. - Christians believe that people should care for God's world. - The Creation story is found in Genesis, the first book of the Bible. - Christians can respond to God's creation with wonder, thankfulness and care.

Links to the RE Curriculum:
(From UC) Pupils will know that: God the Creator cares for the creation, including human beings. As human beings are part of God's good creation, they do best when they listen to God. The Bible tells a story (Genesis 3) about how humans spoiled their friendship with God (sometimes called 'The Fall'). This means that humans cannot get close to God without God's help. The Bible shows that God wants to help people to be close to him – he keeps his relationship with them, gives them guidelines on good ways to live (such as the Ten Commandments) and offers forgiveness even when they keep on fall-ing short. Christians show that they want to be close to God too, through obedience and worship, which includes saying sorry for falling short.
